



Annual Report 2010-2011

The past year marked the realization of many strategic priorities for the National Coaching Institute. First, the amalgamation into Canadian Sport Centre Pacific was finalized, with the NCI-BC taking over the “coaching department” within the organization. This change is a significant benefit for the delivery of High Performance coach education and support for British Columbia’s top coaches. The second major priority saw the implementation of a brand new curriculum, which had been under review for the past two years. The New Advanced Coaching Diploma replaces the old NCCP Level 4 curriculum and will be delivered predominantly on a Part-time basis over two years. Finally, the International Coaching School continued as a significant value for the education and accreditation of coaches.

Mission

The NCI-BC develops world-leading coaches at all stages of the Canadian Sport for Life framework to positively impact athlete performance.

Moving forward, the NCI-BC plans to expand accessibility with a new Canadian Sport Centre Tri-Campus delivery schedule and by moving the International Coaching School to the month of May. Both of these initiatives will help provide ongoing opportunities to develop world class coaches within High Performance sport in British Columbia.

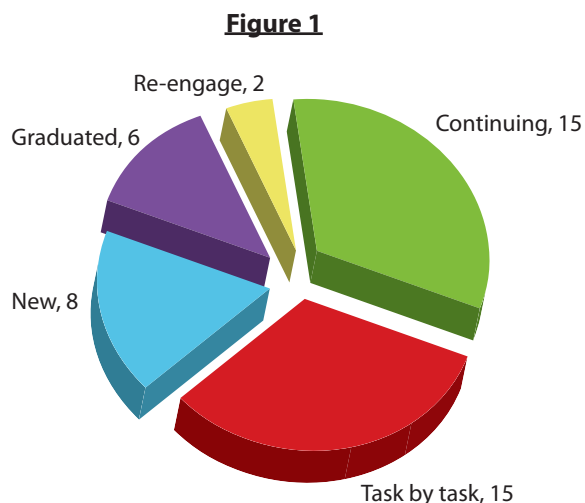

NCI Enrollment

In 2010-11, the NCI-BC enrolled eight coaches in the new NCI Advanced Coaching Diploma at the Canadian Sport Centre Pacific campus in Victoria. The NCI-BC supported 46 coaches in their attainment of advanced coaching qualifications, with 15 engaged on a task-by-task basis and 31 in the diploma program.

International Coaching School

The International Coaching School welcomed 43 coaches who engaged over 124 hours of National Coaching Certification Program delivery from 18 specialists. The annual evening social was attended by over 80 people, including the Honourable Ida Chong, the Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development, and Anne Merklinger, Own the Podium's Director of Summer Sport.
