





# **Canadian Sport Institute Pacific** and BC Alpine **Athlete and Coach Nomination Criteria**

#### **PURPOSE**

Canadian Sport Institute Pacific, through a partnership with the Province of British Columbia (BC), viaSport, the network of PacificSport centres, and BC Alpine collaborates to deliver programs and services to place BC athletes1 onto National Teams, and ensure athletes and coaches have every advantage to win medals for Canada. The partners work jointly to encourage sport excellence and increase podium performances in communities throughout BC.

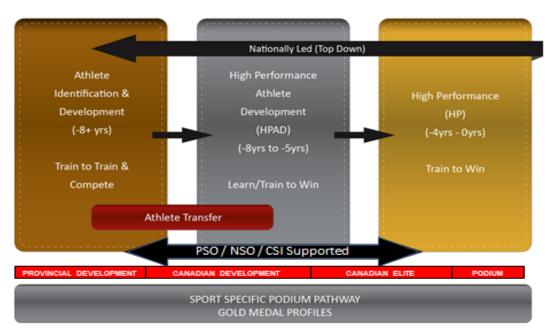
This template provides a standardized process to identify athletes and coaches within the BC Alpine high performance program as well as athletes who are tracking against key development pathway metrics toward national teams. The levels within the targeting seek to create a common standard across all sports; hence, the template must be used in its entirety. PSO/DSOs are able to adapt the template to suit their own purposes (e.g. branding, application process, etc.) provided all relevant information is contained within.

Canadian Sport Institute / PacificSport athlete and coach support for the Podium and Canadian Elite nomination focuses on athletes and teams 0-4 years from the Podium, identified by the sport-specific Podium Pathway (see Figure 1 below) and Gold Medal Profile. These athletes and teams represent the current generation of National Team athletes who are carded by the NSO through Sport Canada's Athlete Assistance Program.

Canadian Sport Institute / PacificSport athlete and coach support for the Canadian Development and Provincial Development nomination focuses on athletes and teams 5-12 years from the Podium, identified by the sport-specific Podium Pathway (see Figure 1 below) and Gold Medal Profile. These athletes and teams represent both the next generation (5-8 years from Podium) and future generations (9-12 years from Podium) of Olympic and Paralympic (or World Championship) medallists. Support may be focussed more toward the future generation (9-12 years from Podium) for some targeted Paralympic sports depending on the quality of the next generation (5-8 years from Podium) of athletes and teams.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In general, a BC athlete is defined as an athlete born, developed, and/or trained/centralized (for a minimum of three months) in British Columbia.

#### **DETAILS**

Through the above partnership, and with the above purpose in mind, BC Alpine may nominate athletes and their coaches who meet specific criteria for Canadian Sport Institute Pacific / PacificSport athlete or coach registration. Upon registering, athletes and coaches can engage in enhanced programs, benefits, and selected support services through Canadian Sport Institute Pacific and the network of PacificSport regional centres in BC.

Canadian Sport Institute and PacificSport athlete support is divided into four levels based on performance, each with a slate of designated benefits. Please click on the following for an outline of Canadian Sport Institute athlete and coach benefits, programs, and services. Please see Appendix 1 for an outline of BC Alpine targeted athlete benefits, programs, and services as delivered through BC Alpine.

Targeted athletes are nominated by BC Alpine based on the athlete criteria below. Any enquiries regarding the sport-specific selection criteria can be made to Johnny Crichton, johnnyc@bcalpine.com As a general principle, all athletes are expected to demonstrate evidence of their ongoing performance progression and tracking toward BC Alpine high performance program benchmarks to remain targeted. Johnny Crichton and the Canadian Sport Institute technical lead working with BC Alpine have the final authority over the Canadian Sport Institute nomination process.

The athlete and coach nomination cycle for Canadian Sport Institute / PacificSport / BC Alpine targeting runs May to April annually, and athletes are selected based on performances from the previous 12 months. Athletes who meet criteria throughout the annual nomination cycle may be added to the BC Alpine targeted athlete list, on a case by case basis, by contacting the PSO/DSO Technical Representative.

# ATHLETE/COACH REGISTRATION

Once the athlete or coach is nominated, he or she will be notified by BC Alpine and will be provided with information on how to register with his or her local Canadian Sport Institute campus or PacificSport regional centre. A Canadian Sport Institute or PacificSport. Athletes and coaches must register with their local centre in order to receive athlete or coach support.

#### **CORE CRITERIA**

- 1. For PSO/DSO nominations, athletes must be considered in good standing (at the discretion of the PSO/DSO) with BC Alpine as a competitive athlete and meet the definition of a BC athlete.
- 2. In principle, all athletes nominated should have a designated coach who is responsible for planned programming with the coach(es)'s name and email identified on the targeted athlete list.
- 3. Athletes who fail to meet targeting criteria due to injury or absence, may remain on BC Alpine nomination list at coach's discretion when:
  - a. There is an expectation the athlete in question would have met criteria if no injury or absence had occurred. AND;
  - b. The athlete in question was previously nominated by BC Alpine in the previous 24 months.

# LEVEL-SPECIFIC CRITERIA

Please note both the Canadian Sport Institute criteria and the BC Alpine sport-specific criteria:

#### Podium / Canadian Elite (Sport Canada AAP Carded)

Canadian Sport Institute Criteria:

Athletes who appear on the Sport Canada AAP Carding List and verified by the NSO. These athletes are in the High Performance (HP/T2W) stage of the Podium Pathway.

# **Canadian Development**

Canadian Sport Institute Criteria:

- Athletes who compete on the senior national team in eligible events, but do not receive Sport Canada AAP funding, and verified by the NSO. These athletes are in the High Performance (HP/T2W) stage of the Podium Pathway. OR;
- Athletes who are in the HP Athlete Development (L2W/T2W) stage of the Podium Pathway (including Gold Medal Profile), and verified by the NSO. If the NSO does not have an approved Podium Pathway, the following criteria will be used:
  - o Athletes who have been targeted as 'Hot prospects' defined as the expectation to be selected to the senior national team in eligible events within 24 months, and verified by the NSO.

BC Alpine Specific Criteria:

- Athletes are eligible following 2<sup>nd</sup> year of FIS racing.
- Athletes whose FIS points are below 30 in one event or below 35 in 2 events (points must be scored in the current year) AND/ OR
- Athletes who have achieved a top 10 Nor Am result in any discipline in the competitive season AND / OR
- Athletes who have achieved a top 15 world ranking by age and younger in any discipline.

Note that athletes who decide to pursue education through an NCAA school may be eligible for Canadian Development carding provided they meet the above criteria. NCAA athletes are not eligible for Provincial level 1 or 2 carding.

Ski cross athletes can be nominated by Alpine Canada for Ski Cross NextGen. or other national development programs.

#### **Provincial Development Level 1**

Canadian Sport Institute Criteria:

- Athletes who are in the Athlete Identification & Development stage of the Podium Pathway, and who are tracking toward the HP Athlete Development stage according to the NSO-specific Podium Pathway and Gold Medal profile. If the NSO does not have an approved Podium Pathway, the athlete must be tracking toward Canadian Development and meet one of the two criteria below:
  - Have competed at the U23 or Junior World Championships in an eligible event (or equivalent international developmental event) in the past 24 months, OR;

Have won a medal in an eligible event at their Sport-Specific National Elite/Open, U23, or U19 Championships (or equivalent level of performance standard) in the previous 24 months.

\*Note: Athletes who are eligible for Provincial Development are typically supported for a maximum duration of 5 years (combined Provincial Development Level 1 and Level 2).

BC Alpine Sport-Specific Criteria:

#### 1. BCST Invitee camp

- 1.1 Athletes to be considered for the Spring BCST Invitee Camp will be evaluated by the BCST coaches. All considered must be registered Alpine Canada athletes. All athletes must make hard criteria (see 2.2.1) with possible exception (see 2.4)
- 1.2 Prior to National Championships, club head coaches or club FIS coaches must submit nominations for evaluation, based on the following:
  - Following the first year of FIS the expected average National Rank by Age (NRBA) 1.2.1 and younger in two (2) disciplines (must include a minimum of one technical event) should be five (5) or lower from the most current FIS list available at the time of team selections, OR average of 2 top 50 International Rank by age and younger. (Must include a minimum of one technical event). Super Combined and DH will be excluded.
  - 1.2.2 If hard criteria are met following National Championships or spring series, that athlete will be invited to a few days on snow if they were not in attendance at the first invitee camp.
  - 1.2.3 For athletes with more than one year of FIS racing - the expected average (NRBA) and younger in two (2) disciplines (must include a minimum of one technical event) should be seven (7) or lower from the most current FIS list available at the time of team selections OR average of 2 top 75 International Rank by age.

#### 1.2.4

- 1.3 Final List: The BCST staff will evaluate the nominated athletes to create a final Invitee list to attend the Spring BCST Invitee Camp which will be distributed after Nationals 2017.
- 1.4 If an athlete doesn't meet hard criteria, Head to Head results may be considered (legitimacy determined and selected by BCST Staff) and be asked to attend the BCST invitee Camp.
- 1.5 NRBA will be considered. See Section 2.4 Head to Head races, including Nor-Am

National Championships BC and Alberta Cups

- 1.6 Outstanding "X Factors" moving into 1st year FIS may be given an invite to the Invitee camp for an evaluation.
- 1.7 Athletes attending the BCST Invitee Camp have an opportunity to be selected to the BCST Training Group based on the selection criteria and the evaluation of the BCST staff.
- 1.8 The final selection of BCST Training Group athletes will be announced at the BC Alpine Coaches Meeting in the spring.

# **Provincial Development Level 2**

### Canadian Sport Institute Criteria:

- Athletes who are in the Athlete Identification & Development stage of the Podium Pathway, and who are tracking toward Provincial Development 1 according to the NSO-specific Podium Pathway and Gold Medal profile. If the NSO does not have an approved Podium Pathway, the athlete must meet one of the two criteria below:
  - Competed in an eligible event at the appropriate age group national championships (or equivalent level of performance standard) and/or place within the top 20% at the appropriate age group provincial championships in the previous 12 months, **OR**;
  - Competed for Team BC at Canada Summer Games or Canada Winter Games in the previous 12 months.

# BC Alpine Sport-Specific Criteria:

- FIS registered athletes whose average NRBA and vounger in two disciplines (must be a minimum of one technical event) is ten (+1) or lower (excludes alpine combined).
- Athletes who have demonstrated potential to move to provincial ski team through performance at the U16 level. Four athletes per gender moving from U16 to FIS will be nominated for Provincial Level 2 carding status. Best 4/11 results scored in the provincial ranking system (PRS) no more than 2 results from 1 discipline, AND OR a podium at U16 Nationals or Whistler Cup automatically ensures eligibility for carding. - Ski Cross athletes are eligible for provincial level 2 carding provided they meet the criteria above for alpine disciplines

#### **Coach Nomination**

# Canadian Sport Institute Criteria:

Coaches are nominated by having his or her name included in the targeted athlete list when they are the coach of an athlete who achieves designated criteria. The PSO/DSO may nominate up to two coaches per athlete in cases where both the Provincial/National coach and a personal coach have a significant impact on the athlete's training program. While not required, it is highly recommended that PSO/DSO nominated coaches meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Be the lead person designing and implementing an annual training program for the athlete.
- Be designated as Provincial or Regional coach by the PSO/DSO.
- Be designated as a National Development / Senior National coach by the NSO.
- Be designated as athlete's coach of record based on sport-specific criteria below.

#### BC Alpine Sport-Specific Criteria:

BC Alpine Specific Criteria: BC Alpine coaches may be targeted and included as a secondary coach on the targeted athletes list who are:

- Level 3 certified, Trained Performance Coach, or possess current exemption letter OR
- Previously coached targeted athlete at juvenile level, or head coach of development club of targeted athlete OR
- Selected to attend BC Alpine High Performance camp and provide coaching to targeted athlete.

# APPENDIX 1 - Sport-Specific Benefits, Programs, and Services

BC Alpine Targeted Athlete/Coach Benefits, Programs, and Services

BC Alpine Targeted Athlete/Coach Benefits, Programs, and Services
Canadian Development
☐ Eligible NCAA athletes invited to train with BC Ski Team through the off-season (at coaches
discretion and subject to available resources).
☐ Eligible NCAA athletes will receive programming for off-snow training in the off-season.
☐ Eligible NCAA athletes will have access IST services on a user-pay basis.
☐ Eligible athletes who are selected to BCST (not NCAA) and who make the 'Canadian
Development' criteria will have access to all BCST training and services.
Provincial Development – Level 1
☐ Year-round coaching and competitive program as per BCST program (pending final selections in
November).
☐ Access to all IST services provided by BC Alpine.
Provincial Development – Level 2
☐ Invitation to the BCST annual selection / TID Camp
□ 1 x HP dryland camp p/year
☐ Possible train/race up during competitive season if the athlete's performance warrants it and
resources permit (at coach's discretion).
